Kaieteur Falls, Potaro River


Vertical drop 741 feet, nearly five times the height of Niagara; width 350 to 400 feet and depth water from a few feet to 20 feet, according to season of the year.



























Diagram showing value of annual output of Diamonds for the years 1916 to 1923 (inclusive).




