I have the honour in presenting to this gathering of stakeholders, the Principal's Report for the academic year, September 2024 to July 2025. This report seeks to enlighten us on our **Achievements**. It also highlights some **Challenges** and **Projections** for the future.

STUDENT ENROLMENT

The academic year began in September, 2024 with a total student population of **five hundred and ninety-seven (597) students**. **There were two hundred and eighty (280) males and three hundred and seventeen (317) females**. The average number of students per class was twenty-six (26).

For the period under review, the admission of students to the college was based on the placement of students by the Ministry of Education.

- One hundred and fifteen students from the National Grade Six Assessment (NGSA) comprising **sixty (60) males and fifty-five (55) females** were admitted to Grade Seven.
- Based on CXC-CSEC, 2025 results, **thirty-seven (37) students** were admitted to Grade 12 to pursue CAPE. There were **ten (10) males and twenty-seven (27) females**.

THE CURRICULUM

Honourable Chairman,

St. Stanislaus College continued to offer a broad-based curriculum to the students through Eleven Departments, namely:

1. Agricultural Science
2. Allied Arts
3. Business Education
4. English
5. Home Economics
6. Industrial Technology
7. Information Technology
8. Mathematics
9. Modern Languages
10. Science
11. Social Studies

At **Grades Seven and Eight**, all the subjects taught were compulsory.

At **Grade Ten**, students were allocated to one of the four streams at the college, depending on their ability, aptitude and career interest. The total number of students who opted for the streams were as follows:

Students pursued a maximum of **ten (10)** subjects in each stream. English Language, English Literature and Mathematics, and one foreign language were compulsory across all Streams.

At **Grade Eleven**, all students wrote the Caribbean Examinations Council (CXC) - Caribbean Secondary Education Certificate (CSEC) examinations. Thirty-one (31) subjects were written.

For **Grade Twelve**, students who gained at least Five (5) CSEC subjects including English A and Mathematics, with Grades I to III were offered a place to pursue studies for the Caribbean Advanced Proficiency (CAPE) examination. Thirty-seven (**37**) students were admitted for this programme and placed into one of three streams:

1. **Natural Sciences**
2. **Environmental Studies**
3. **Business.**

EXTERNAL EXAMINATIONS RESULTS, 2025

Caribbean Secondary Education Certificate (CSEC) Results

Esteemed Chairman and Audience,

The academic performance of our students at the CXC-CSEC 2025 was excellent. A brief analysis of the results revealed that:

- Students wrote **thirty-one (31)** subjects at this examination. The overall percent passes gained for Grades One to Three was **92.5%**.
- Out of the **ninety-one (91)** Grade Eleven students and **One (1)** Grade Ten student who wrote the CSEC examination **Ninety-Four percent (94%)** of them matriculated. This means that 94% of our students got at least Grades One to Three in at least five subjects, including English A and Mathematics.
- There were **three hundred and sixty-nine (369)** Grade Ones, **three hundred and ninety-eight (398)** Grade Twos and **two hundred and ten (210)** Grade Threes.

His vision has driven the development of a revamped School Improvement Plan and Budget framework designed to guide the institution's growth for years to come. - Financial assistance for local and overseas educational trips for students and staff
- Funding for signature school events such as Graduation and Prize Giving ceremonies
- Annual bonuses for academic and ancillary staff, along with Teacher Appreciation Day celebrations
- Prizes, awards, and funding for sports programs and athletic events
- Annual bursary awards for students facing financial challenges
- Welcome gifts for Grade 7 students, including backpacks, books, and school supplies
- Direct support for staff needs, such as laptops, refitted and refurbished laboratories and other essential resources dedicated to the delivery of the curriculum
- Annual Christmas staff socials and dinners
- Countless acts of philanthropy that touch every corner of school life

These examples represent just a glimpse of the extraordinary ways the SSCBOG nurtures, supports, and sustains the vibrant Saint Stanislaus College community.

I wish to especially highlight the commitment of our overseas Alumni who have been raising money for the last 25 years to support St. Stanislaus. The founders and the executive members of the

Toronto Alumni Association, whose average age would be in the mid-seventies, have at least four fundraisers per year. They have been consistently providing St. Stanislaus College, through our local Association, in excess of three million dollars per year. Their hard work and commitment year after year is impossible to understand and our appreciation can never be overstated.

The continuation of construction, means there is restricted play area and students continue to litter and contribute to the frequent damage of infrastructure and facilities.


